**THE HISTORY AND MYTHOLOGY OF GREECE FROM THE
BRONZE AGE TO THE HELLENISTIC AGE**

This spring 2019 semester-long course will provide a rich comprehensive study of Greek mythology, philosophy, culture, and theatre which will include hands-on travel shortly after the conclusion of the term. The two-weeks spent abroad will entail a cultural feast, with visits to the Acropolis and the National

Archeological Museum. Students will tour the birthplace of the Olympic games at the ruins of Olympia. They will explore modern Greek culture in Corinth and go on to experience the ruins of Epidaurus, Crete, the Heraklion Archeological Museum, Athens, among other locations.

- **Cost is approximately \$3400.** Includes airfare, ground transportation, some meals, most – if not all – admissions, lodging, and travel insurance.
- **Easy payment plans available.** The earlier you sign up, the smaller the payments!
- **Let the world become your classroom:** combine traditional instruction with travel to historical Greek destinations.
